




#### HOLY FATHER'S PRAYER INTENTIONS

#### Liturgy Reflection

The Holy Spirit, who came upon Jesus at his baptism, who came upon each of us at our own baptism, plays two major roles in today's Gospel. First, the Holy Spirit is the one who leads Jesus out into the desert. Jesus' forty days in the desert recall the Israelites' journey of forty years. Unlike the Israelites, who grumbled about their hunger, chose to worship other gods, and wished they were back in Egypt, Jesus was able to

resist temptation. Which brings us to the other role played by the Holy Spirit, the role that may be overlooked even though it is revealed in the first five words of today's Gospel: "Filled with the Holy Spirit." Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus was able to resist every temptation the devil offered. Each temptation was an opportunity for Jesus to use his divine power for his own benefit. This is not why God became human. This is not why Jesus was sent. Just the opposite; he came not to save himself, but to save others. We too have received the Holy Spirit. We too are filled with the Holy Spirit. Therefore, we too can rely on the Holy Spirit, God's presence within us, to help us resist temptation.

#### Passing the Test

"Test" is a four-letter word. Spelling tests, driving tests, SATs, all bring a knot to the stomach. Tests are something we would rather forgo, but also something we must undergo. Lent, too, is a four-letter word and is also a kind of test, for the only way to Easter is to pass through Lent. Today's reading from Deuteronomy commends Israel for its faith in the God who saves. No matter the tribulation, Israel's faith enables it to persevere. This faith/test theme also appears in the reading from Romans. Paul boldly asserts that faith in Christ will see the believer through any trial. The Gospel passage makes it clear that even Jesus was tested. It describes a test, a struggle between good and evil, that dramatically demonstrates Jesus' faith in the power of God's life in him. This power enables him to overcome temptation. This power is with all of us who celebrate the test of Lent, a power enabling us to pass with flying colors.

#### A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

Okay – it's that time again – a week late – but still good to refresh memories. During Lent primarily, according to the "Outlines of the Catholic Faith", what are the "rules" for Fasting and Abstinence?

Fasting means eating a lesser amount of food – only one full meal or two smaller meals daily, nothing between meals. Catholics who are 18 and not yet 60 are asked to observe. There are two fast days – Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Abstinence means not eating any meat. All Catholics over the age of 14 are required to abstain on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, we both fast and abstain. Contrary to some beliefs – Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of Obligation.

We're starting to get some questions about baccalaureate. We have the church calendar marked for May 23 (graduation is the 25th) at St. Ann.

The "Little Black Book for Lent" is still available but going fast – we still have some in the narthex – but "The Little Purple Book" for Children has disappeared from the shelves. We believe the books are taken by the grown-ups as soon as they see there are games and pictures in the books. We're not sure if we'll get another shipment or not so – grownups – as soon as you've finished the games, please bring the books back.

Last week, as part of the Optimist Youth Appreciation program the GB Optimists and City of Gulf Breeze hosted members of the GB Junior National Honor Society in a "take over the city" program that included each city official having a GBMS student counterpart. After a breakfast/pairing up at St. Ann on Friday, the students toured the city and all departments, then on Monday night the students took over the city council, conducting the regular Monday night meeting. It was a great experience for all concerned. My counterpart as Mayor Pro Tem was parishioner Elyse Fulford. She did a great job, and I think she has a bright future in government, although for now she is a member of the medical academy and is aspiring to be a doctor.

Golf carts in Gulf Breeze and Tiger Point – both areas are dealing with the issue. The city has issued its golf cart ordinance, but folks are not exactly overrunning city hall to get their carts registered. The GBPD will most likely pull you over if you don't have the little yellow decal on your right lower windshield. Maybe a first time warning, but they have indicated they will enforce it. Tiger Point has two issues – the privately owned golf carts doing damage to the course and the walkers. The walkers have been there since the course has been there. When we lived at Tiger Point there was a period after Hurricane Ivan when the

courses were closed and folks got used to walking when they pleased, and for some that habit continued even after the course re-opened. I found that if I walked at 6 in the morning or 8 at night, I wasn't bothered and didn't bother anybody. A tough one to solve.

M-W's Word of the Day: "Vox Populi" (VOKS-POP-yoo-lye) – a Latin phrase that literally translates as "the voice of the people." It can also be found in the longer version of "The voice of the people is the voice of God." Many think that expression means that the people are always right, but it really implies that the will of the masses – right or wrong – is often irresistible. I think my wife employs a certain version of that phrase when she reminds me that she is always right.


#### "LENT A HAND"



Now that we have discussed what blood pressure is and what the normal and abnormal values are, let's discuss the potential effects that uncontrolled high blood pressure (hypertension) can have on your body. Uncontrolled hypertension can cause serious damage to your organs like your heart, kidneys and brain.



**Heart** - hypertension can cause the heart to become enlarged and hardening of your arteries. Hardening of arteries causes decreased blood flow and oxygen to the heart which can lead to heart disease, angina, heart failure and heart attacks. **Brain** - hypertension can affect the arteries in the brain causing a stroke. In the event of a stroke, there is a lack of blood and oxygen to the brain causing potentially irreversible effects such as change or loss of speech, vision, movement, cognition or even death. **Kidneys** - hypertension puts a lot of stress on the kidneys and if not treated can cause kidney disease.
