


HOLY FATHER'S PRAYER INTENTIONS

Parishes at the Service of the Mission

That our parishes, animated by a missionary spirit, may be places where faith is communicated and charity is seen.

Challenge for the month:

Provide spaces for reflection on the effective testimony of members of the parish, in terms of works of mercy that can be done.



Liturgy Reflection

Last Sunday's call to watch over and correct a brother or sister engaged in wrongdoing gives way this Sunday to an urgent command to forgive. Clinging to anger and a desire for vengeance invites a similar response from God. Sirach records God's demand that we

forgive others if we wish to be forgiven. Today's Gospel continues this theme. After Peter asks Jesus how many times we must forgive, suggesting the generous offer of seven times, Jesus counters by calling for limitless forgiveness. To reinforce his message, he tells the parable of the unforgiving servant. After the master forgives a debt impossible for his servant to pay off, this same servant then throws a fellow servant in jail for not paying off a paltry sum. The master then responds in kind to this unforgiving servant. Jesus' point: God demands we forgive because we have been forgiven. If God can forgive us for all that we have done, how can we possibly refuse to forgive one another? Saint Paul brings it home: We belong to the Lord and so are to do what the Father wills, which is to forgive each other.

Reconciliation

Holding on to anger dissipates any forgiveness given to us, as it did for the forgiven servant who refused to forgive the servant who owed a lesser debt. The first servant's refusal to forgive was viewed by his peers as a great injustice and so he lost everything, including respectability. That servant lived only for himself. Our call is to live for the Lord by loving one another as God loves and forgives us, not seven or seventy-seven times, but infinitely. The way we do or do not forgive is the measure for how we experience God's presence in our lives. Vengeance can seem sweet at the time, but it only opens the door to the Lord's vengeance, as Sirach notes. Not because God is vengeful, but because our hands are so full they cannot receive the kindness of our merciful God. Open your hands and your heart. Receive the mercy of God and do unto others as God does to us. Forgive.

A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

The Interfaith Disaster Response (IDR) Team held its first meeting of the year last week (Sep 6), just as Hurricane Irma was starting to bear down on the US. The meeting was well-attended by city and emergency personnel as well as most of the local churches. Assignments were handed out to the churches, and each group reported on its readiness to respond. In addition to our assignment to provide hot meals to the public, we are also requested to provide back-up housing (sleeping area). That one is a little dicey because we don't have a great number of cots, plus our emergency generator can't provide power to both the parish hall and the family life center. We'll have to work on that one. We have not yet called a meeting of our St. Ann IDR team, but we did check out our sources during and immediately after Irma. The emergency generator received a new radiator last week and has been tested and ready; we checked out our food vendors and learned that we have to be very aware of where our food comes from – Publix closed for a day or so just before Irma hit because most of their tech support comes from their headquarters in Lakeland – which was expected to be under water. Our regular food vendor would not have been able to fill our orders because they pull from their warehouse in Tallahassee – so we must order early or expand our shipping sources. We have only 19 hardy souls signed up to work the kitchen and hall should we go into IDR mode. Getting somewhat into the IDR mode, we fed 35 folks at breakfast on Monday, and another 20 or so for lunch, including a first responder group from Arkansas waiting for their assignments downstate.

Schools and activities were closed on Friday before the storm and Monday afterward, primarily it seems, to prepare the schools as shelters in case the need arose. Since the Discovery School normally follows the lead of the Santa Rosa School District, we were also closed, although getting the word out to parents and teachers was a little problematic since we only found out the night before. We had some parents who didn't find out about the closure until they arrived to drop off their children, so we'll definitely tighten up our notification procedures and not depend on social media. We had some questions as to whether we would open as a shelter. The diocese reported that no structure in the diocese is designed for a shelter and that we should not open our doors as a shelter until after the storm. The county EOC further stated that they would not open any shelter in the south end of the county due to the possibility of a large number of people getting "marooned" on this side of the bridge.

Just for info – the diocese requires all parishes to have in reserve 5% of its appraised value (what it would take to replace everything). For St. Ann that's \$521,500.00, and for Our Lady it's \$177,900.00.

Brother Charles, who spoke at each Mass last weekend, thanks you for your generosity in support of the Navajos at Klagetoh. Almost \$9,000 was collected from the two churches. That, on top of the hurricane victims' support, is evidence of the generosity that exists in the parish.

CSCA numbers are in for the month of August and show both churches above goal and on track for a successful campaign – although last year's numbers were actually better at this stage. 392 families are participating from the parish, which at 41% for Our Lady and 35% for St. Ann is about average for the diocese. As a parish (St. Ann and Our Lady), our goal is about third highest in the diocese.

Congratulations to Carol Lyvers who just celebrated her 29th year at the St. Ann Discovery School. A lovely lady who loves those children.

HEALTH TIPS BY MELISSA

Religious Service Attendance is Associated with Reduced Mortality in Women



In a recently published study, they wrote how they followed 74,534 healthy women for 20 years to evaluate the relationship between attendance at religious services and mortality. Women who attended a religious service two or more times a week had a 33% lower all-cause mortality rate than those who never attended.

Regular and frequent attendance of religious services was associated with a reduction in cardiovascular and cancer mortality in women, and they even mentioned that clinicians might consider exploring spirituality with patients when appropriate.
