



Liturgy Reflection

Alleluia! He has risen. Alleluia! He has conquered death. Alleluia! He has brought salvation to the world. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! back to our vocabulary. We sing it, we shout it, we proclaim it. Throw open the doors and windows! This is too big to be contained. The veil of the sanctuary, torn in half when lesus died on the cross, is a sign of this, for

the sanctuary could no longer contain it. The stone that was rolled away from the entrance to the tomb is, too, for the tomb could no longer contain it. The new life that Jesus brought about through his death and resurrection is too great to be closed up. It needs to escape into the open, bursting forth for all to share. Last night, the Church around the world welcomed its newest members. Today we renew our own baptismal promises, recalling the day that we became members of the Church. As members of the Church, we are called to spread the Good News, as the apostles did after Jesus' death and resurrection. We do not just shout and sing Alleluia! to oursleves. We celebrate the redemption Jesus won with everyone. Alleluia indeed!

Seeking

Easter Sunday is a day all abut seeking. The early Christian communities gathered around the Apostles, seeking more about the life and ministry of the Lord Jesus. Saint Paul told the baptized Colossians to "seek what is above." Mary of Magdala went to the tomb, seeking to find the Lord's body so that she could anoint it. We come to church on Easter Sunday seeking many things. For some of us, this is a once-a-year journey, when we seek connection with the foundations of the Christian faith. For others, this day is the culmination of a long journey of Lenten repentance. For the newly baptized, this is the first day of a new life filled with promise and expectation. Whatever it is that we seek, let us be inspired by the disciple whom Jesus loved who, when he saw the wrappings of cloth inside the empty tomb, "saw and believed."

A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

SAVE the DATE: Vacation Bible School - July 23-27.

Parish Directories – Jody has finished the first round with the directories. We're doing them in-house this time so you don't have to sign up to buy a bunch of pictures – in fact you don't even have to take a picture. We're going through the proof-reading stage right now, so there's still time if you have moved, changed email or phone numbers etc.

I recently had one of our readers take exception with something I wrote which was critical of a local business. He further stated that I had no right to interiect my own opinions in the column and that I should applicate to the prognization and in the future stick to church business. (I suppose I could quote from the CARA (Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate) that a recent Gallop report says that, "Fewer than one in four Americans now believe the Bible is "the actual word of God, and is to be taken literally, word for word".) I started this column more than nine years ago primarily as a way to get information to our readers in an informal way and to encourage readership of the bulletin. 
