

Liturgy Reflection

The life of a prophet is not easy. Prophecy demands one go against the flow. Ezekiel had an especially difficult task. He was called by God to prophesy just after the Chosen People were driven into exile. Somehow, he had to restore a sense of trust that God was still God, still all-powerful and still faithful to the covenant. But the Israelites were understandably "hard of face and obstinate of heart," having been defeated by the Babylonians and evicted from the Promised Land. Jesus faced an equally stubborn people in his fellow Nazarenes. Whether they were resentful or just plain skeptical, they could not accept that a great prophet could possibly have come from among their number. But if there is to be a positive lesson here, Paul points us toward it. Initially he begs the Lord to remove the infirmity that afflicts him. Scripture scholars are not sure if this is a physical ailment, an opponent, or something else entirely. But whatever the case, Paul makes his peace with it, realizing that in his very weakness the grace of God shows itself most strongly. The power of God manifests itself most clearly in overcoming a difficulty, not in being easily successful.



A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

Due to the holiday and required early submission, this will probably be even more useless than normal by the time you get it. I'll have to give you my usual gripes about fireworks in the hands of amateurs in a later version, well after the 4th.

We've just contracted with a local company to provide two more ADA approved ramps for the curb areas in front of the St. Ann Church. Hopefully that will make it easier to accommodate those in wheelchairs or walkers. And, did you notice the fresh new signs around the St. Ann campus? Our old ones have served us well but were getting a little weather-beaten, having been in place since 2001 (I believe - don't hold me to it).

Construction on the classroom expansion at Our Lady continues to run smoothly. We're still saying August 15, but the contractor is a little more optimistic, saying maybe earlier. Still looking for ideas, furnishings and, of course, cash donations to fill the rooms.

St Anne - I was rummaging through some old file cabinets and came upon a brochure commemorating St. Ann's early years - 1949 - 1960. It is noted that the original name was St. Anne, and it's not quite known when the "e" was removed and it became St. Ann. Some of the folks who "summered" in Gulf Breeze wanted a place to worship without having to go "in town", so the Bishop allowed them to build a small chapel "over the bay". The St Anne Chapel was a mission church of St. Michael in Pensacola and was built in 1949 on property donated by Mr. Carl Hoffman. The building was 25 x60 feet, 30 pews, cost \$5,000 and was completed in just 4 weeks. It served as a mission until 1958, then was designated St. Anne Parish. In October, 1958 the land for the new church (present location) was deeded to the diocese by Mr. Hoffman. The "new" church (Yellow brick) offered its first Mass in August, 1960. The original church building was sold and, when my family arrived here in 1981, it was "Granny's Old-Fashioned Donuts". It's now the Knowledge Kollege at 5 Hoffman Drive. I'll leave a few of those brochures in the Narthex for interested readers.

In its search for a City Attorney the City Council has narrowed the list of candidates to three and held its first interviews with those folks on June 28. This time around the council is looking to hire a firm rather than an individual because of the workload. We hope to choose and have our new firm in place within a few weeks.

We lost a good man recently. Bill Balch was an usher, Food Bank Coordinator, loyal member of the Knights of Columbus, family man, veteran (Army Air) and all-around good guy. His usher friends and the Knights will be manning the doors for him at his funeral Mass tomorrow (July 9).





HEALTH TIPS BY MELISSA

Whole foods rich in protein, omega-3 fatty acids, zinc and biotin may help promote a healthy scalp and hair. Add these goods to your grocery cart - think of them as ingredients in a healthy hair recipe!
