

Liturgy Reflection

It is Isaiah who wrote, "The Lord called me from birth, from my mother's womb he gave me my name", but it just as easily could have been John the Baptist. He was also called before birth to serve the Lord. The angel Gabriel appeared to Zechariah to announce that his wife, Elizabeth, would bear a son who would "be filled with the Holy Spirit even from his mother's womb ... to prepare a people fit for the Lord". Indeed, the works of the Lord were proclaimed before John even spoke a word. First of all, Elizabeth was advanced in years and thought to be barren. The fact that she bore a child was acknowledged to be a gift from God. Secondly, Zechariah had been struck mute by Gabriel because he questioned the angel's testimony. When he wrote "John is his name", Zechariah could speak once again, a sign of God's power. These works of the Lord, performed on the parents of John the Baptist, "were discussed throughout the hill country of Judea". What the Lord had done could not be kept quiet. Like Isaiah before him and Paul after him, John the Baptist embraced the call to testify to the Messiah.


HOLY FATHER'S PRAYER INTENTIONS

Called by God

Traditionally, a saint's day is celebrated on the anniversary of their death, since that day marks the day of their entrance into heaven. But we also celebrate John the Baptist on the day of his birth. Perhaps this is because he was called by God before he was born. Luke writes that John the Baptist was filled with the Holy Spirit in his mother's womb. But let us not forget that the Holy Spirit came to each of us when we were baptized. God called John the Baptist to prepare the way for Jesus. In baptism, God calls us to prepare the way for Jesus in the world today. John the Baptist completed his mission by purifying himself in the desert, then traveling throughout the region, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, teaching people to be honest and generous, and preparing them for the Messiah.

Three of our youngsters have pulled off an extraordinary feat – Macy Mateer, Luke Stringfellow and Milly Ladner have all been accepted at Notre Dame University. It seems that the school has a quota-type system where, in their efforts to serve all areas, they only choose a certain number of applicants per region, and to have selected 3 students, not only from one city but all from the same parish, is very rare. They'll join parishioner, Jessica Laenger, who preceded them. Congratulations to all, and you'll probably find some pictures elsewhere in this edition.

Speaking of smart kids – another Mateer has made us proud – this time Max, a competing freshman from PHS/IB, has placed first in the National History Day Senior Individual Performance Category. This gives Max back-to-back National Championships since he won last year as a GB middle schooler. Max is one of 600,000 kids worldwide to compete and talks about things like, "Conflict and Compromise - Pushing the Pawn from the Purchase to the Pacific." Ten years ago GBMS teacher and parishioner, Grace Freeman, started this program and has now reached superstar status as she has produced 4 national champions. Big sister Mattie set the bar for the younger Mateers before heading off to TCU. The Mateers don't just pick up their medals and disappear. Both Max and Macy have won Optimist Oratorical State Championships and now help train and coach those who follow. As a result, 4 of the last 5 state championships have been won by Gulf Breeze students. Speaking of Mateers – their business "Ciao" has just been named Gulf Breeze Area Chamber of Commerce Business of the Month, and they'll be eligible to compete for the Business of the Year. Speaking of those things – Our Lady has been selected Pensacola Beach Chamber of Commerce Business of the Month. A clean sweep for the parish. We have good people.



HEALTH TIPS BY MELISSA

You've heard it dozens of times - nuts are good for you but don't eat too many because they are full of fat and calories. However, research indicates that the reality is somewhat more complex - and that's good news for nut-lovers who are watching their



weight. A study published in the *American Journal of Clinical Nutrition* revealed that while a handful (about 22 kernels) of almonds contains 170 calories, only 129 calories are actually absorbed by the body. The rest are passed, because the protein and fat in them are relatively hard to digest. Even better news - after one daily handful of almonds, three percent of the calories you consume for the next 24 hours are rendered indigestible. That means if you eat 2,000 calories in a day, the almonds you ate in the morning will remove about 60 calories from that total. The effect probably applies to other kinds of nuts, although only almonds have been rigorously studied. So enjoy your nuts on a daily basis - their monounsaturated fat content appears to lower cardiovascular risk. Opt for the least processed versions possible from raw to lightly toasted and salted yourself.
