



Liturgy Reflection

A “no weeds” approach to life is tempting. When we find an idea, a value, an action, or even a person or group of people that threatens what we think or do, appreciate, or honor, the tendency is to oppose it. Cut down this weed and burn it. Jesus counters this impulse in today’s parable of the weeds and the wheat. Premature action could lead to destruction of life. So, the wise householder decides to let weeds and wheat grow together until harvest, so the wheat can be saved. This parable mirrors the reading from Wisdom, which speaks of God as one who judges with clemency and governs with leniency, giving people “good ground” in which to grow. Such divine generosity is also exhibited in the parable of the tiny mustard seed that grows into a bush housing all the birds who dwell in its branches, and in the parable of the yeast that signals the penetrating power of God’s mercy. St. Paul writes about the Spirit interceding for us even in our weakness. Overall, today’s scriptures place God firmly on our side, even when destructive powers (“weeds”) threaten to overwhelm us.


Evangelization: Those Distant from the Christian Faith

Patiently Awaiting Judgment

Matthew, more than any other evangelist, talks about Jesus leaving and returning home. Often Jesus leaves the house because crowds have assembled outside and want to be taught. Today, after having taught and dismissed the crowds, his disciples follow him home, seeking further explanation of what seem to be, at least to us today, pretty straightforward parables. For both Matthew and Mark, when Jesus is in the house with his disciples it signals a special teaching moment, and it should cause us today to perk up our ears. Usually it is Jesus giving commonsense advice about what it will mean to follow him. Today is no different. To follow Jesus means to be ready to encounter the followers of evil, to have to live and work and preach among them. It means patiently awaiting the judgment that can only come from God. Let us heed this house-teaching, for it will be the same for us who follow Jesus Christ today.

A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

Msgr's anniversary Mass and parties at St. Ann and Our Lady were very successful. The Mass at St. Ann was attended by more than 300 (including 15 fellow priests and deacons). An additional 75 joined us in the parish hall for the Broussard's pulled pork, grilled chicken and all the trimmings, including banana pudding. Our Lady followed up on Sunday evening with a shrimp and chicken alfredo feast. It was great seeing all the enthusiasm among the many volunteers who joined in – from the planning to the decorating to the clean-up crews. The Knights took over the huge function of providing adult beverages at St. Ann and the Our Lady hospitality crew handled food and drink at the beach. Our newest member, Jody Daily, jumped in to coordinate the committees and functions and did a great job (so I guess we'll keep her). Lynn, Anne and their crew made sure all were served well at the Our Lady dinner. All-in-all, more than 450 joined in the celebrations. Hopefully you had a chance to see the Gulf Breeze News spread this past Thursday which is all about Msgr Hunt.

CSA status for the month ending July 31: Our Lady of the Assumption is cranking along in over-goal by almost \$2,000 while St. Ann is still \$5,737 shy. Our electronic reader board has fallen to time and the elements so we'll be ordering in a new sign shortly – we have to get it permitted through the city even though the actual size and specifics don't change. It'll probably take about eight weeks.

We now have 4 memory trees planted – 3 in front of the school and another near the corner of Daniel and Joachim. Remember – if you want to plant a tree in memory or honor of a loved one come see us, we'll help you pick a spot, you can then go to Mike's Garden, pick it out and they'll plant it for you.

You may have some folks knocking on your door and collecting for Escambia Search And Rescue (ESAR). I double-checked with Shane Carmichael at City Hall and he says they're legit. While Gulf Breeze has its own rescue service, ESAR has the capability of handling the bigger and longer-lasting missions for Escambia and the city of Gulf Breeze. They're a non-profit, so your gift can be put on your taxes.

Our Lady has finished one phase of the renovation/expansion of the parish hall. The new coffee bars are up and running, there's some new kitchen equipment, plus the electrical wiring has been re-routed to handle bigger loads. The Jansen crew (one of our advertisers) did an excellent job with the project. The architect/job administrator is moving along with the design and engineering for the new classrooms/music room. We also have received the go-ahead for the repair/replacement of parts of the sound system at Our Lady, so you'll be seeing the Blues Angel crew out there shortly.
