


Liturgy Reflection

Every so often life gives you a glimpse of glory - the beauty in a sunset, goodness in a person, truth in words spoken, peace and well-being in a friendship. Sometimes it comes suddenly; other times it's been there but you haven't been

paying attention. Still, it is real. This happened to Peter, James, and John. Jesus often went off to pray, to be in the presence of his Father. On this particular occasion, while praying, his glory shone through and his disciples saw it. They also saw Moses and Elijah, speaking with him about his coming death, his passing over into full glory. Jesus will go on to speak to his disciples about his coming suffering and death.

But for now, they are given a glimpse of the glory awaiting them at the end of the road. We too need a reminder of our destiny, that "our citizenship is in heaven". Our Savior has promised he will come and "change our lowly body to conform with his glorified body". For now, hear the Father's words: "This is my chosen Son; listen to him". Our ultimate glory may depend on it.

Trust

"In God We Trust" marks the currency of our nation. It should mark our lives as well. However, we hesitate to trust others, including God, absolutely. We prefer to hold our trust in reserve, fearful of being hurt or betrayed. Today's readings remind us that Lent is a season of trust - a trust that transforms. God makes a remarkable promise to Abraham. To receive this promise, all Abraham needs to do is trust. Paul tells the Philippians that they too must trust that they are the beneficiaries of God's bountiful grace; that they are not citizens of any earthly kingdom, but citizens of heaven. These two readings invite us to hear the Gospel account of deep trust - trust that God will fulfill all promises and that Jesus' passage will lead to transformation and new life.

A WORD FROM TOM NAILE, CAVEAT LECTOR

Skepticism – A doubting or questioning attitude – Webster – as in “The request for help in replenishing the Food Pantry was met with skepticism by some who had toured our supply rooms.” In this case I believe it was a case of mistaken identity. We have run ads in the bulletin for the Interfaith Ministries Food Pantry the last couple of weeks. But, to go ahead and address that issue: Yes, we have ample supplies of mac and cheese, canned vegetables and canned soups, as well as rice and instant potatoes. What we consistently run short on is pasta, pasta sauce, peanut butter, jelly and canned (pop top preferred) meats and fish. Remember, we provide assistance to some homeless folks who don’t have a microwave at hand. Also, the St. Vincent DePaul Conference at St. Sylvester is starting to refer people to the St. Ann Food Bank as well. We keep a shopping list in the St. Ann Narthex and encourage parishioners to bring donations the first weekend of each month. An ample supply of food allows your Christian Service Commission to move some of those donated food dollars to other worthy food causes – such as Loaves and Fishes and the Weekend Food Program. If there’s a concern that we receive too much – we always share with the other food pantries in the area.

This weekend and next will be “Follow-up Sundays” for the CSA 2016 campaign. All should have received pledge cards by now. If not, your address isn’t current with the diocese and we need to update it for you. Just from looking at numbers of pledge cards that we’ve seen (some send cards and checks directly to the diocese or on-line) we’re getting off to a good start.

Those Our Lady folks who have been asking “What are we building?” when Karen announces that the second collection is for the “building fund” will have the opportunity to find out at a town meeting on February 28, immediately following the 9:45 Mass (don’t worry – you’ll get a chance to get your doughnut) in Hunt Hall. If the crowd is too large we’ll move to the sanctuary. It’s an opportunity to discuss the feasibility of adding conference/class rooms on to the existing facility. You’ve maybe seen the architectural rendering in the Narthex. That’s simply an idea to build from. This will be a joint effort of the Our Lady parish and parish finance councils so, if the group feels they want to go forward with it, a committee can be assembled and put to work. Mark your calendars.

Last fall the parish participated in a “Church Fully Alive Parish Survey”. Each church did an “in-pew” survey where you were asked a total of 24 questions concerning your agreement or disagreement with statements involving your “Member Engagement”, “Spiritual Commitment” and your general satisfaction with your personal/church life. A total of 562 parishioners responded to the survey (465 from St. Ann, 97 from Our Lady). Over the next several weeks we will use this space to inform you of the various responses. We’ll also let you know how we compare to all religious groups, all Catholics, and the diocese average. We will have copies of the entire survey available if you would like to read them.

First question under the “Member Engagement” – *“As a member of my parish, I know what is expected of me.”*
256 strongly agreed, 6 strongly disagreed and 44 were not sure.

First question under the “Spirit Commitment” – *“I spend time in worship or prayer every day.”*
313 strongly agreed, 13 strongly disagreed and 7 were not sure or it wasn’t applicable.


