Liturgy Reflection

“Rejoice with Jerusalem ... exult, exult with her”. God’s loving, maternal presence is mirrored in Jerusalem, as the prophet boldly proclaims in the first reading, moving from a restored Mother Jerusalem who nurses and comforts her people, to God who says: “as a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you”. Similar joy is experienced by the seventy-two Jesus sends out. He gives clear directives stressing the urgency of their mission: travel lightly - no money bag, no sack, no sandals, no chatter along the way. Settle into one household, wishing peace and making do with the accommodations offered. Don’t fuss over the food. Most of all, cure the sick and preach the good news that God’s kingdom is near. The result - joy! In the opening of *The Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis writes that our joy is continually reborn. With that, we are invited to begin a new chapter of evangelization, made distinct by this joy. Today’s readings trace this preaching task from Jesus to the disciples, then to Paul, who clearly locates his joy in preaching Christ crucified, thereby ushering in a new creation. It’s our turn to witness to Christ.

First Reading - Isaiah 66:10-14c

As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you.

Psalm - Psalm 66

Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.

Second Reading - Galatians 6:14-18

May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel - Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus sends out the seventy-two.



Mission

Today’s first reading from Isaiah was occasioned by the return of the Jewish people from exile. The prophet visualizes the Holy City as a mother welcoming her children home. The people may now look forward to prosperity and comfort. In this post-Pentecostal season, the Church attributes this sense of fulfillment to the Holy Spirit. Paul, on the other hand, speaks of “the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.” It is the single thing of which he will boast, for it is the means by which we are re-created. The comfort and prosperity promised in the first reading are here transformed by a deepening of the Christian paradox. Luke’s Gospel describes the calling and the mission of “seventy-two others,” who are commissioned to bring in the “harvest.” The number is symbolic, since according to Jewish tradition the number of nations in the world is seventy-two. This then is a universal mission, a catholic mission to all the world.

Tax scammers – We’ve received yet another report from a parishioner that they were contacted by persons supposedly from the IRS stating that they are in trouble with the IRS and must follow certain instructions in order to clear up the matter. Again – be aware – the IRS doesn’t call anybody. If they want to talk to you they will send a very impersonal form letter informing you that you must get in touch with them. In this case they probably would be interested in having you report the scam to them.

Thanks again to our loyal office volunteers, Nancy and Doris, who stand by the office and answer the phones when the office staff needs to be elsewhere.

We recently hosted a meeting of members of the diocese who will need to implement the changes brought about by the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) revisions to the overtime regulations which take effect December 1, 2016. It’s a major change to a program that hasn’t been adjusted since around 1975 so you can imagine it has some employers a little anxious. We will be checking to see what adjustments we have to make as a non-profit entity. You can be sure it will be something that costs more – not less.

Pardon our wet paint as Kent and Anthony are methodically re-painting the parking stripes and renewing some of our handicapped parking. Some of the old signs in the main lot are a little misleading. Our Lady gets its paint job later in the summer. Once we’re finished we’ll mention to GB Hospital that their lot needs re-striping as well.




ASSISTANCE FOR VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ABUSE
