

HOLY FATHER'S PRAYER INTENTIONS

That the scandal of child-soldiers may be eliminated the world over.

That the peoples of Europe may rediscover the beauty, goodness, and truth of the Gospel which gives joy and hope to life.



Liturgy Reflection



Pope Francis says the gospel constantly calls us to rejoice. That is certainly true today. Isaiah's vision promises a healing of two bodies: the earth's body and the human body. What was a parched and dry desert will blossom and bloom. Glory and splendor will replace gloom and sorrow. Feeble hands and

weak knees, the blind and the deaf, the lame and the mute - all will meet with joy and gladness. When will all this come about? When God comes, says Isaiah. Then Luke proclaims: This has happened in Jesus of Nazareth, in the person of a carpenter-preacher-healer-exorcist-Savior, once crucified, then raised, and who promises to come again. Can you hold on to this? The Letter of James counsels patience, a word rooted in the Latin word for suffering. One must suffer waiting for a new world's arrival. But joy is found even now because the Lord visits his waiting people in word and sacrament, and in others. This Sunday allows for wearing rose vestments as a sign of the coming joy Advent promises: "He will come again".

Promise Fulfilled

Today's readings address the faithful one, the one who waits on God but may not feel God's presence. Every person who seeks God has at one time or another experienced the absence of God. Jesus himself cried out during his dark night of the soul. The Epistle of James speaks to this. The author says that we must be as patient as the silent, fallow earth that awaits the slow, soaking rains of winter and the hard, necessary rains of spring. As the farmer is sure of the precious yield of the land, we can be sure of the precious yield of our patient waiting. God is never far away. The messengers from John the Baptizer asked Jesus if he was the one whose coming John had announced. The messengers wanted to hear the answer that the imprisoned John already knew. Everything that John said was finally happening: because of Jesus, light shines in eyes; words of promise are received; people leap and dance. The promise of Isaiah is fulfilled in Jesus. Wobbly knees and feeble hands are strong, the desert blooms, the savanna and steppe flower, the darkness is chased away.

We served more than 175 diners, plus the knights were out in force. An enjoyable get-together for all. I hear the breakfast for Msgr at Our Lady was also excellent and well-attended.

Hopefully you had a chance to go to the Christmas parades last weekend, both in Gulf Breeze and Pensacola Beach, although PB was severely weather-challenged. St. Ann Parish was well represented as we prepared floats for both parades (Discovery School, Knights of Columbus and Lifeteen on Saturday and Our Lady was all dressed up and ready to go for the PB parade on Sunday before being rained out). We had our quarterly visit from our J. S. Paluch rep last week. They print our bulletins. more appetizing.



By now you're becoming soporific so I'll close down.





HEALTH TIPS BY MELISSA Mediterranean Diet May Be Good for Your Eyes.

The Mediterranean Diet consists mainly of fruits, vegetables, whole grains, nuts, healthy fats, and fish. In this study, researchers assessed the diets of 883 people and found that those who closely followed this diet



had a 35% lower risk of age-related macular degeneration, especially for those who ate a lot of fruit. Lead author Dr. Rufino Silva notes, "This research adds to the evidence that a healthy, fruit-rich diet is important to health, including helping to protect against macular degeneration."


