



Liturgy Reflection

It has been said that a narcissist is one for whom every doorknob is a mirror. That is not the kind of vanity that the teacher Qoheleth refers to in today's first reading. The teacher is taking a long-term view of

life, seeing all things as passing, empty, including those things we often cherish most. Jesus is being the wise teacher when he advises a petitioner concerned about getting his share of the family inheritance that true riches are not located in possessions. The parable of the rich man worried about having enough barns to store all his grain challenges us to consider what we value most, to what degree our life is given over to hoarding as much "stuff" as our consumer society offers, rather than sharing with those in need. The Letter to the Colossians then invites us to change our focus to "what is above", to Jesus Christ who intercedes for us with the Father. Communion with the risen Jesus is the true wealth God wishes us to have. Living in Christ brings ongoing transformation, our becoming "rich in what matters to God".

Barns Filled with Riches

In a rare Ordinary Time confluence, all three readings counsel us not to focus on things of the world. The first reading calls all such things "vanities". Saint Paul tells us to think of what is above, for Christ is all in all. And Jesus urges us to be rich in "what matters to God". As we listen to these readings, let us try to hear what God is telling us about what really matters. It is always good to be reminded, as we are in today's readings, of what really matters, for our lives do not consist of our possessions. Today let us pray that we treasure what is truly important in our lives - all the people to whom we are called to reveal God's mercy - and leave the rest to God.

A WORD FROM TOM NAILE, CAVEAT LECTOR

"STEM" stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. It's a curriculum based on the idea of educating students in those four disciplines in an interdisciplinary and applied approach. Rather than teach the four disciplines as separate and discrete subjects, STEM integrates them into a cohesive learning paradigm based on real-world applications. Santa Rosa County schools are introducing an add-on to this program by inserting an "A" into the mix. "A" stands for "Arts", so we now have the STEAM program in Santa Rosa Schools. The theory is that none of these other disciplines work if you don't have a way of tying all four together and explaining them. In the coming school year, if you get a chance to observe this program in action, do so. I believe it's only for 5th and 8th graders and their teachers right now.


