

Liturgy Reflection

Food, fortune, fame - the temptations sound like categories from TV's Jeopardy. "Feed yourself, you're starving", Satan said. After forty days of daytime heat and nighttime cold, Jesus could not have had much energy. But it wasn't physical strength that was

needed; it was strength of the spirit. Jesus was not lacking that. The Spirit had come upon him at his baptism, had driven him into the wilderness, and did not abandon him now. First temptation: Use your power to feed yourself. Jesus' answer: God's word is my food. There I find strength. Second temptation: Bend the knee to me in exchange for all the kingdoms of the world. Jesus' answer: Only God deserves worship; the only kingdom worth having is God's. Third temptation:

See if God is with you by throwing yourself off the temple. Jesus' answer: You don't test God; you trust God. As Israel was tested in the desert, tempted to turn from the God who delivered them from Egypt, so Jesus is tested. But Jesus, the new Israel, the beloved Son, trusts his Father. That Spirit who was with Jesus during his testing is with us.

Passing the Test

Tests are something we would rather forgo, but also something we must undergo. Lent, is a kind of test, for the only way to Easter is to pass through Lent. Today's reading from Deuteronomy commends Israel for its faith in the God who saves. No matter the tribulation, Israel's faith enables it to persevere. This faith/test theme also appears in the reading from Romans. Paul boldly asserts that faith in Christ will see the believer through any trial. The Gospel passage makes it clear that even Jesus was tested. It describes a test, a struggle between good and evil, that dramatically demonstrates Jesus' faith in the power of God's life in him. This power enables him to overcome temptation. This power is with all of us who celebrate the test of Lent, a power

enabling us to pass with flying colors.

CSA 2016 was "presented" last weekend at all services. Hopefully you were able to see the Bishop's address to the diocese. You should have received your pledge cards in the mail this past week. If not, call us here at the office and let's make sure we have your up-to-date information for our church data base. This is Commitment Sunday as we continue to emphasize the need for your gift. As I mentioned last week, your pledge goes to the diocese and you can do it the old fashioned (but effective) way or you may want to try the on-line method. Let us know if you need help there.

We co-hosted the monthly Gulf Breeze Area Chamber of Commerce meeting last week, along with Chick-Fil-A (they provided the breakfast and we provided the space and coffee). This is an excellent arrangement since it doesn't involve an "all hands on deck" effort by the staff and the local members really enjoy the friendly offerings of our parish hall. Plus, we know Chick-Fil-A will provide its usual excellent food and service.

By the time you read this (if you do) Beef O'Brady's (casual sports bar-type dining) should be very close to opening its doors. It's in the WalMart building next to Hallmark which, sadly, will be closing its doors on February 29. There's also, finally, some action on the old Benson complex on the corner of Northcliffe and 98, which is expected to house a Dunkin Donuts, AT&T Store and a Mattress Firm.

The folks who purchased the church property on Joachim are continuing to work their way through the approval process with the City of Gulf Breeze. As soon as that is completed they will be more able to provide us with the information on new construction. We'll keep you posted.

Next weekend we'll be providing some information on "The Church Fully Alive Survey" we conducted last fall. You may remember – it's a series of questions indicating (agree to strongly disagree) your general satisfaction with your place in the parish. There were around 30 questions, so we'll try to summarize and get the results to you. As always, we have copies at the office if you want to scrutinize in great detail.

We're starting to share the food bank with the St. Sylvester Conference of St. Vincent DePaul, so we're seeing an increase in demand. If you'll pick up a few extras the next time you go shopping it will help to restock the shelves. As always, PB&J, pasta, pasta sauce, vegetables and fruit are in demand. We're in pretty good shape with mac and cheese.






