Liturgy Reflection

Today's reading from Deuteronomy is an excerpt from Moses' farewell speech to the Israelites as they are about to enter the Promised Land. Moses emphasizes that keeping the law God gave them is the condition

for living in an intimate covenantal relationship with God. God's law is not beyond their comprehension. Indeed, it is as near to them as their own heartbeat, and God's word has been put into their mouths, so they can remember it and carry it out. We discover God's closeness to us by reflecting on Jesus, who "reconciled all things, . . . making peace by the blood of his cross". He is both the image of the invisible God and the head of his body, the church. God calls us to recognize and honor this closeness to all God's children. In the parable of today's Gospel, Jesus challenges a scholar of the law by holding up a Samaritan who sees in a man beaten and left on the side of the road, a neighbor worthy of his mercy and care. Our faith calls us to see all people as our neighbors, as near and dear to us as they are to God, the Father of all.

Today's Readings

First Reading - Deuteronomy 30:10-14

The word of the Lord is very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts.

Psalm - Psalm 69

Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live.

Second Reading - Colossians 1:15-20

Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God.

Gospel - Luke 10:25-37

The Samaritan traveler was moved with compassion at the sight of the man stripped and beaten by robbers.



Living God's Commands

The first reading forms part of Moses' farewell discourse, a call to the people to return to God. It is not a legalistic summons; rather, it is an appeal to heart and soul. It outlines a command that is not impossible to follow, or too difficult to undertake, or too expensive. Look into your hearts, says Moses; there you will find what to do. Paul sees Jesus Christ as the image of God, the agent of creation and preservation. We sense, in his words, things profound: "dominions or principalities or powers." But in the midst of that, Paul keeps his attention on Jesus Christ, head of the church. It is in Christ that we find fullness and reconciliation - in the blood of the cross. Luke's Gospel illustrates the double commandment of love with the story of the Good Samaritan. The story is a radical one, for it comes to focus on the question of who my "neighbor" is. That neighbor is not identified with any group, but rather by the scope of our compassion.

A WORD FROM TOM NAILE, CAVEAT LECTOR

Our new Parochial Vicar, Father Thomas Kennell, has joined us and already has several Masses under his belt. If you see a young, red-headed priest wandering around the campus, go up and introduce yourself and welcome him.

We are continuing our summer projects, completing some, some still in the works, still finding some every day at both locations. We close down most activities during the month of July – no Wednesday night dinner, no Sunday breakfast (St. Ann) in order to complete projects that take more than a day or so. Our Lady will complete a revision to its sound system by mid-month, and the classroom expansion group is working with the architect and SRIA, making the changes necessary to get approval to start building the project. Kitchen and parish hall tweaking is being done as well at Our Lady as they happily contend with large crowds and continue the doughnuts and coffee after each Mass. At St. Ann most of the 24 year old AC units have now been replaced (at a cost, but necessary), parking lot striping, painting and repair of other areas, plus continuing the maintenance and upkeep of the rectory keep the maintenance team on the move. The next large project will be indeed large – the parish hall roof replacement. We're getting the bids now.

So, we've now limped into the new fiscal year and hope we have budgeted well for this coming year. We will have payroll adjustments to make by December 1 of this year to conform to the new FLSA overtime exemptions, and I'm sure our business friends in the parish are going through the same adjustments.

You may have heard of the City of Gulf Breeze recent decision to not accept an offer for 2.2 million for areas needed by the FDOT to complete the new bridge construction. Other sources tell the city that the property is worth more like \$13 million, although the FDOT says it's public land and they don't really have to buy it – they can just take it. It remains to be seen as to whether that was a good move or bad – either way you have to respect the City Council's willingness to challenge the big guys.




ASSISTANCE FOR VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ABUSE
