Today's Readings

First Reading - Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24

Psalm - Psalm 30

Second Reading - 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15

Gospel - Mark 5:21-43



Liturgy Reflection

The goodness of God in times of need is in full display in today's readings.

The author of the book of Wisdom wrote at a time that Greek culture had permeated Jewish traditions and Greek rule had divided the Jewish community.

Wisdom tries to reconnect the people to their ancestral faith. God's creation is good, and it not include death. We were

created to be immortal, in the image of God. Though the devil brought sin and death into the world, "justice is undying". Living in accordance with God's goodness leads to unending life with God. A century or so later a severe famine in Jerusalem inspires Paul to write a primer on Christian charity. Those who have in abundance are obligated to give to those who are in need. After all, Jesus, though he was God, emptied himself for our sake, allowing us to become rich in his grace. In today's Gospel, Jesus encountered two people in need: Jairus, whose daughter was ill to the point of death, and an unnamed woman, who had been suffering hemorrhages for twelve years. Despite the opposite ways they approach Jesus, the faith of both in the goodness of God and in the power of Jesus over disease and death leads to healing and new life.

The Lord of Life

At this bountiful time of year, our Sunday readings teem with life and abundance. Both the first reading, from the book of Wisdom, and the Gospel passage from Mark assure us that God did not make death or even will us to be ill. Illness and death entered the world through the presence of evil, the Wisdom author tells us. Mark's stories of Jesus healing a hemorrhaging woman and resuscitating a dead little girl make it clear that Jesus is from God. As the Son of God he does not will that anyone suffer illness or death. In the face of such power, the second reading, from Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians, provides a stark contrast. Jesus, who could raise the dead to new life, "though he was rich, for your sake he became poor". Our gift of new life from Christ demands our response in charity.

A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

The Our Lady school expansion group (mostly Parish Council members) is moving along in its quest to provide the furnishings – or allow others to chip in – for the new classrooms and meeting rooms. Paige Bindi is leading the charge for the meeting/all-purpose room(s), while we're asking the actual teachers to determine what's needed in the Sunday School classrooms. Anybody looking to help out – just give us a call. August 15 will be here before we know it.

You may remember that some of the folks complained about the way the city does business, and enough jumped in to convince Senator Broxson that there were serious problems that deserved an audit – so – we now have one. The team has been camped out at City Hall for the past couple months interviewing folks, checking all the paperwork and generally doing what auditors do. Although they work for the state, most of them are local, I think. I was interviewed a couple months back – very pleasant people, professional and keeping a low profile. What has been the most surprising part of this venture to me is the huge amount of staff time required to produce all the documentation. Some requests require every staff member to drop what they're doing and dig up some old contracts or reports. All are necessary things that must be done and I'm sure the results can be a teaching opportunity, but I hope any official who calls for such a procedure will keep in mind the tremendous amount of staff resources required and the resulting overtime the city is paying for.

FYI – Lillo's Tuscan Grille is now up and running in the old La Brisa location. Reports are that it's doing pretty well, considering it's in the middle of the bridge construction area. Great place to watch the sunset. I can remember when that was the "Holiday Inn Restaurant", and a dinner with iced tea cost more than a dinner with beer or wine – since Gulf Breeze was dry and the alcohol was complimentary. They also had a hospitality suite where they served free drinks to the guests. Most of the time there were more locals there than visitors.

The City Council is still struggling with the golf cart ordinance – which probably means it's not "doable" in its present format. The proposed ordinance went back to "first reading" status last week when we were unable to agree on some of the items. The biggest challenge is trying to open up enough streets to enable riders to move about the city, but, as written at this point, you can't drive on any street with a speed limit of 35 MPH – which takes out Fairpoint, Shoreline, South Sunset, Daniel Drive, US 98 and the overpass. Drivers may cross some of those streets to get to their destination, but no crossing of 98 is permitted. Of course, this means the people on one side of 98 can't visit the folks on the other side – and vice versa. We're trying – really.

Green Tea's Impact on Cognitive Function Now Visible

Green tea appears to boost memory by enhancing functional brain connectivity, a new imaging study suggests. A study led by Stefan Borgwardt, MD, PhD, from the Department of Psychiatry, University of Basel, Switzerland, shows that drinking a green tea extract enhances memory performance, a finding that researchers suggest may have important clinical implication for the treatment of neuropsychiatric disorders, including cognitive impairment.

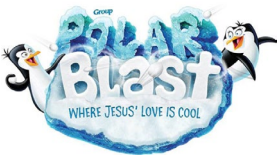

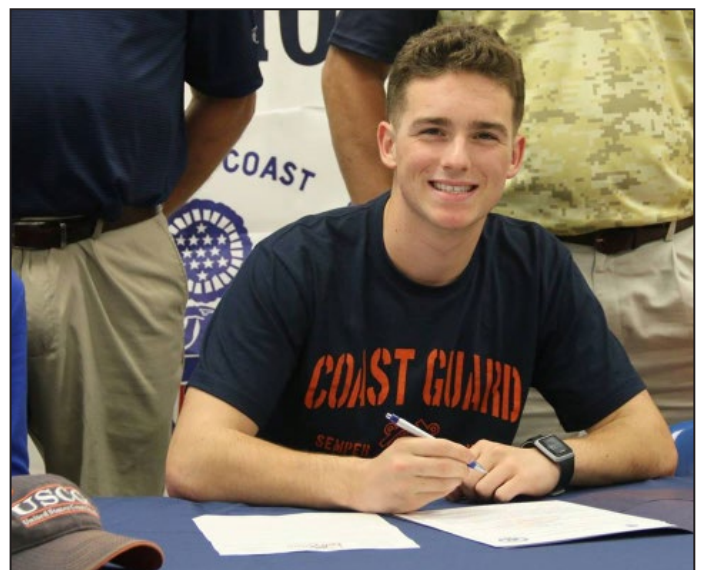
