



Liturgy Reflection

Is Jesus for real when he says we must hate our parents, hate our spouse and children, even hate our life? Hyperbolic, yes, but it is still a call for total commitment. Today's Gospel lays out the cost of discipleship,

which also includes carrying one's cross and renouncing all possessions. In other words, a disciple must be willing to let everything else yield to the commitment to Jesus. If a new world is to be fashioned according to the wisdom of God, if the battle between good and evil is to be won, the commitment to the Lord must be total. Paul is asking a similar thing of Philemon when he urges him to take back his runaway slave, Onesimus. Here we find the seeds for dismantling the system of slavery, in which other human beings were considered property. A runaway slave would have been punished, sometimes severely. Paul is asking that Philemon welcome Onesimus back as Philemon would welcome Paul himself, as a brother in Christ. A renewed world will only be made by renewed laborers, committed to building up the kingdom of God.

Attitude Change

Today's readings ask us to re-think our attitudes and ways. The passage from the book of Wisdom reminds us that, when it comes to understanding, even the wisest person barely scrapes the surface of things. In Paul's provocative little letter to Philemon, the apostle praises Philemon for his understanding of the social order - which included slavery - and for his good treatment of Onesimus. Then Paul goes on to drop his bombshell. He tells Philemon that Onesimus is now a Christian and should be treated as such - as a brother, an equal. What was Philemon to think? Today's Gospel tells us that if we are to follow Jesus, we must do some serious planning. Then, once all our planning is complete, we have to be willing to accept the fact that our plans are never enough.

A WORD FROM TOM NAILE, CAVEAT LECTOR

We had the Bloodmobile visit the St. Ann campus last weekend, and our generous donors came up with 25 pints, which is sure to please the folks at the collection base. As Msgr says, "We not only take up the collection here, we also take your blood."

Our 2nd collection for the Louisiana flood victims will finish off this weekend, and we'll choose another parish to receive whatever funds we end up with. Although our diocese has asked for donations, we have already fulfilled that obligation and chose to send funds and gift cards directly to designated affected churches.

The Weekend Food Program has begun. If you don't remember – this is a program in which students who are eligible for free and reduced lunches are provided food to take home for the weekend. What started as a small program a few years ago is now covering all eleven schools in the south end of the county – up to 500 kids per week. You can help by donating your time to help bag the meals (Mondays at 5:15 at the GB Presbyterian Church) or assisting with food procurement and storage. Our Lady Parish Council Chairman, Mike Stahl, is now heading up the program. As always – financial assistance is welcome. We support this group through our food bank program.

TRIM – By now you may have received a nice note from your county property appraiser – if you own a home and pay taxes on it and maybe/maybe not have homestead exemption. This will accompany your "Notice of Proposed Property Taxes". There's a little flyer that's entitled "Understanding your TRIM (Truth in Millage Notice). This helps you figure out how your property taxes are set based on the most recent appraisal. It shows what to do if you disagree with any of these numbers and also advises of upcoming public hearing dates and locations. (Be sure to read and heed the part that says, "DO NOT PAY – THIS IS NOT A BILL")

By now – hopefully – the longest no-name (Invest 99, TD09 and maybe Tropical Storm Hermine/Ian) has made its landing and has gone on its way. Even though, at this writing, we were projected to be outside the cone, there's always another one out there ready to wreak havoc. We note that – if we have to activate our IDR team, we are very short on names of folks we can call to fill the shifts of an up-and-running kitchen. We still have forms in the narthex at each church if you'd like to sign up.

A gentleman wrote to the GB News last week complaining that he wanted to visit the new Dunkin' Donuts but just couldn't find a way to get there. I don't think he looked hard enough. Granted – it's not the easiest access from certain areas, but generally – if you're headed toward Pensacola, go through the light and turn right on Live Oak. If you're coming from Pensacola, make a u-turn at the light and go right on Live Oak. If you're coming from Northcliffe, take a right. You just can't make a left on Northcliffe because of those little armadillos in the street.



HEALTH TIPS BY MELISSA

Why do we need Vitamin K?

Vitamin K is necessary for normal blood clotting and for maintaining optimal bone health. This fat-soluble nutrient is required in only small amounts to perform its important functions in the body, and is not usually recommended as a supplement in large doses. In fact, a healthy diet fulfills the vitamin K requirements of most people. Leafy greens (Swiss chard, kale, parsley, Brussels sprouts and spinach), broccoli (cooked), cauliflower, liver, and wheat bran are all foods naturally rich in vitamin K. Your intake of vitamin K (from diet and/or supplements) should be carefully monitored and regulated if you take anticoagulants or blood thinners, as the therapeutic effects of many of these drugs are influenced by vitamin K.
