

Liturgy Reflection

This Sunday we celebrate our intimate communion with Christ and with all the members of the Body of Christ in the Eucharist. Just as Baptism brings us into sharing the life of the Trinity, celebrated last Sunday, so the Eucharist brings us into a most intimate sharing in the mystery of Christ's saving death and resurrection. In the Gospel of John, Jesus declares that he himself is the bread come down from heaven, and that the one who eats his flesh and drinks his blood has eternal life even now and will live forever. Paul underlines the Eucharist as a meal that allows us to participate in the body and blood of the Lord and that signals our unity with each other, holding up the one loaf of bread as a sign of many becoming one. This sacrament empowers us to give ourselves in service to the world. We are fed by both the word of God, as Moses reminds the people about to enter the Promised Land, and by the sacrament of the Eucharist.

Take a look around the walls of your church. Even if it's only a year or two old, the word "Amen" has resounded off those walls countless times at the conclusion of the Eucharistic Prayer and as the faithful have come forward to receive the Body and Blood of Christ. Today's feast is about those "Amens" offered in faith, offered in times of trouble or doubt, spoken in joy, spoken mindlessly, but all given to God in a multitude of ways. It is our very lives that lie behind our "Amens" and are touched by the presence of Christ, the presence we celebrate today. More importantly, we celebrate the love of Christ for us shown in the sacrifice on Calvary and that he continues to give to us in every celebration of the Eucharist. What can we do but rejoice in that great love, and then go out into the world and live that love in sacrificing for others?



A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

CSA numbers for May 31st: Our Lady is within \$45 of reaching its goal of \$30,496.37 while St. Ann is shy about \$21,000. Good. Our Lady is virtually in the overgoal mode now and St. Ann should be there shortly. As you may recall, once we're in overgoal all contributions go directly to the primary savings accounts of the respective church.

We recently found that, due to an oversight on my part, we were paying taxes on our Gulf Power service at Our Lady when, as a religious non-profit, that is not required. We're not sure just how long this had been happening but it was significant enough that Gulf Power has just credited Our Lady with \$5,697 for back taxes. Many thanks to two Gulf Power associates (who are also parishioners) who jumped in and expeditiously cleared up the matter. I'd list their names but they're shy.

Question: What happens when a WalMart 18-wheeler misses its delivery street turnoff and heads down a small (no outlet) residential street with a tight cul-de-sac? In this case – plenty – since the driver was well into the cul-de-sac when he determined he couldn't make it. In what became a spectator sport for the residents over the next hour the truck slowly backed its way up the street. After many starts and stops and backing and filling, two mail boxes, yard encroachment and numerous tree limbs the driver managed to extricate himself and his truck from the street. This was almost as bad as the truck (also WalMart) that decided to turn around in the post office parking lot and would up stuck behind the post office. An interesting area I live in.

By now our first contingent of summer campers will have returned. The middle schoolers just spent the past week at Hidden Lakes, a religious retreat facility in North Georgia. If you see a bunch of kids running around in matching t-shirts with some similarly dressed grown-ups (who look tired) ask them about their week in the mountains. I think you'll like the answers. Still to come – the Grenada Group (going to Grenada no less) and the Covecrest teens who will also be headed to North Georgia in August.

Thanks to Kim Hogan, Lynn Clark and the other committee members for working this project and persistently pushing the contractors for better pricing. The project will come in under budget. The classroom additions are still in the works plus we're awaiting approval for the new sound system that David has been working on.



HEALTH TIPS BY MELISSA

A Simple Breathing Exercise Everyone Should Try

This requires no equipment and can be done anywhere. Although you can do the exercise in any position, sit with your back straight while learning the exercise. • Exhale completely through your mouth, making a whoosh sound. • Close your mouth and inhale quietly through your nose to a mental count of four. • Hold your breath for a count of seven. • Exhale completely through your mouth, making a whoosh sound to a count of eight. • This is one breath. Now inhale again and repeat the cycle three more times for a total of four breaths. Note that you always inhale quietly through your nose and exhale audibly through your mouth. Exhalation takes twice as long as holding your breath, speed the exercise up but keep to the ratio of 4:7:8 for the three phases. With practice you can slow it all down and begin inhaling and exhaling more and more deeply.


