Liturgy Reflection

The Gospel today - the multiplication of the loaves and fish - is a familiar one. In fact, it is the only miracle story found in all four Gospels. Not only that, a similar miracle is recounted in the second book of Kings, which we hear today as well. An unnamed donor gives twenty barley loaves to Elisha, who immediately orders that they be given to the people to eat, for there was a famine in the land. In adding generosity to generosity, this "man of God" has transformed as much as one person was able to carry from a distant town into what was more than enough to satisfy the hunger of a hundred people. In the Gospel, it is Jesus who "took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them," transforming the five loaves of bread into more than enough to satisfy a crowd of over five thousand. These two signs, Elisha and Jesus generously sharing what began as a meager amount of food and satisfying the hunger of many, point to God, the source of all generosity. How can you share what you have been given to satisfy those who are hungry?

Feeding the World

With today's two accounts of feeding miracles and the psalm response about the Lord's hand feeding us, it is easy to gloss over the marvelous hymn in Ephesians. It is built around the most potent biblical numbers: one, three, and seven. The core of it is the word "one" expressed seven times. Three of these describe the church: one body, one Spirit, one hope; the next three are the foundations of the church: one Lord (Jesus), one faith, one baptism. All of these are bound up together in the one Father of all. While we might feel daunted by the prospect of duplicating the wonders worked by Elisha and Jesus in the feeding of multitudes, Ephesians gives us a more realistic way to live and "feed" others as the church: by living in humility and gentleness, by acting with patience, bearing with each other in love, and always seeking and striving to preserve unity through peace. Who among us cannot increase the way we "feed" the church and the world by living this way? We are always called upon to "feed" the world in the literal sense; but our mission as church tells us that others are also fed by the way we live and act each moment of each day.

A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

Busy week at St. Ann this past week. Vacation Bible School (VBS) kicked off on Monday and “graduated” Friday. 125 or so youngsters crowded the campus for some fun days. Of course, nothing can be a success without tons of volunteers who work tirelessly to keep the kids focused and entertained (and fed). Rona and Grace and all their support team do a great job every year.

Last weekend I put my aging body into my aging truck and headed off to Arkansas for a school reunion (my 60th). I’m happy to report that both body and truck made the 960 mile round trip without incident. I always look forward to crossing over the bridge of the mighty Mississippi River into Helena, AR. (Of course, first you have to pass the casino). The river is close to a mile wide at that point and there’s usually some tugboat and barge traffic. Lots of history in that old river town, and if you’re a blues fan, you’ll know the area I’m referring to (including the Clarksdale, MS area).

We do this reunion every two years for all who attended Elaine High School (pop. 744 during my years there – smaller now). There were the usual jokes about how old all the others are getting, but it’s a little strange to hear one of your classmates frankly looking at the chances of being there for the next one.

This is the Delta, which means major farming operations. Driving through AR and MS you see cotton, corn, maize, soybeans and rice fields for as far as the eye can see. You still see some of the jerkwater towns (not meant disparagingly – see below) but most of the railroads they served are no longer operational. The only traffic problem I had was at the foot of the 3 mile bridge – turns out it was quicker to go the Garcon Point Bridge route.

Jerkwater (Wordsmith) “In the days of steam trains, locomotives needed frequent refills of water. They made water stops near streams and lakes and hauled water up to the boiler. These trains were called jerkwaters from the jerking of water in buckets. In time they built water tanks along the tracks. Since these stops were in remote, insignificant areas, the towns around there were known as jerkwater towns, and eventually the adjective jerkwater came to be applied to anything small, insignificant, backward, inferior, etc.”

Over the next couple months, as we finish up the Our Lady construction, the contractor will move over to St. Ann for the construction of a new entry canopy – you can see the architect’s rendering in the parish hall. This will help our ADA folks in parking and entering Nickelsen Hall. We’ll also be installing acoustic tile, audio/visual equipment, painting and re-doing the floors. We’ll try to do all this with a minimum of upheaval, but it may require moving some activities around. By now also we should have finished “re-lighting” the St. Ann sanctuary and narthex, with the chapel soon to follow. Also, we’re looking at increasing the handicapped parking slots in front of the church where we have the new cutouts.






HEALTH TIPS BY MELISSA

Food as Medicine

Avocados are rich in healthy monounsaturated fats. Oleic acid accounts for over half the fat in avocado which gives it a similar fat profile to olive oil. These fats have been shown both to increase the absorption of fat-soluble carotenoids and reduce the risk of heart disease. In addition to being a naturally low-glycemic food with a whopping seven to eight grams of fiber per cup, avocado is also full of rare 7-carbon sugars that may have a special ability to regulate blood sugar metabolism. Broccoli has a powerful cholesterol-lowering effect. Its fiber-related components bind to bile acids in the intestine and escort them out of the body (instead of these acids being absorbed with the fat that they were initially released to digest). Because cholesterol is needed to produce bile acids, this temporary depletion draws upon the body's cholesterol stores, lowering overall cholesterol levels. Although raw broccoli has cholesterol-lowering properties, the effect is significantly enhanced when lightly steamed. Broccoli is also a member of the cruciferous vegetable family, hailed in nutritional medicine for supporting hormone balance.
