Liturgy Reflection

What is this fire that Jesus came to cast on the earth?

In the Old Testament God often worked with fire.

Remember Sodom and Gomorrah? Or the time that Elijah the prophet called on God to send down fire to

swallow up a slaughtered bull laid over sodden wood, and everything within a five-foot radius was burnt to a crisp? But neither of these passages is linked with today's Gospel. Instead we get Jeremiah being tossed down a well for his discouraging words about the military might of Jerusalem. The prophet's words burned up both misplaced hope and false confidence. So more likely it is referring to the fire of God's word.

Jesus spoke God's word and it incinerated former understandings of family, creating a new family marked by commitment to Jesus. Jesus gave us words that continue to form a family of faith by burning up our self-centeredness, purifying our minds, and setting on fire hearts deadened

by too much of so much: too much grasping for more and more, too much worshiping of homemade deities, too much surrendering to what will never completely satisfy.

The Costs of Discipleship

Today's story of Jeremiah and the refrain "Lord, come to my aid!" remind us that there are always two sides to following the call of God. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews knew this, too. He reminded his readers that

even weighted down with burdens and sins, we can still persevere by keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, who himself knew the shame and pain of the cross, but saw beyond it to the joy of sitting at the right of the throne of God. Jesus himself gave the disciples a "sneak preview" of a baptism that would not be as wondrous as the one in the Jordan that inaugurated his ministry, but would be one of fire and anguish. Today's words from scripture may not be terribly soothing, but in their honesty and strength we can acknowledge the difficulties of daily discipleship, and take comfort in the assurance of our own salvation in Christ.


