

Liturgy Reflection

The second encounter from John's Gospel this Lent is with a man born blind. As with the Samaritan woman last week, we too are invited to know Jesus in an intimate way, this time as bestowing the sight to recognize him as the One sent by God. Our first reading foreshadows today's Gospel by presenting

the experience of the prophet Samuel, who comes to "see" David, the youngest son of Jesse, as the one God has chosen to replace King Saul, rather than the eldest son, Eliab, whom Samuel assumed would be God's choice. Eliab, like Saul, is tall. "Don't judge by appearances,"

God chides. In the Gospel, we see once again a person's gradual coming into the light that is Jesus, finally recognizing him as more than a prophet, as the Son of Man who is the Lord. For those of us who are baptized, seeing goes even further than recognizing Jesus as the Light of the world. As Ephesians proclaims, we who "were once darkness ... now ... are light in the Lord" and should lead lives of goodness, righteousness, and truth.


HOLY FATHER'S PRAYER INTENTIONS

This is a great vocation, a calling to wake people up to what's really important.

A NOTE FROM THE PARISH ADMINISTRATOR

CSA In-Pew Sunday results were slightly underwhelming – a total of 12 responses. Hopefully some of those envelopes were taken home and will come back to us or directly to the diocese. It was probably not a great weekend to do this since we had spring break and resulting low attendance. Of course, that was only one phase - it was not the end of the campaign. You can still sign up through the end of the year. Our progress is good even if some of the numbers are a little off. St. Ann is up to 24% of families participating and Our Lady is at 26%. The highest percentage of participation in the diocese is at 59%, however that's a little mis-leading – they only have 66 families.

Audit services – Our Parish Finance Council is taking us through an auditing program (internal) and the audit committee has been spending a great deal of time going over the books and procedures for St. Ann and the Discovery School. This is a valuable service for which we're very grateful. If we had to pay for this we would be looking at thousands of dollars. These folks are very busy and very talented, and we're very fortunate to have such expertise and commitment in our parish.

We recently sent a group to Atlanta to participate in the Amazing Parish Conference. The group of five, representing clergy, staff and ministries will be presenting their "learnings" to the staff, then the parish council, then on to other ministries as we determine areas and activities to integrate into the parish. Our representatives felt that they learned a lot but were also pleased to see that we are already practicing many of those ideas in our discipleship.

Look for a continuation of activity on our picnic grounds as local boy scout troops work toward merit badge completion and Eagle Scout projects. One of the projects will be an enhancement of the fire pit area – handmade benches, clearing the area of undergrowth and adding equipment for the safe use of the pit. What you may not know is our Troop 417 does flag retirement ceremonies – so – if you're wondering what to do with that old tattered American flag, just drop it off at the office and we'll get it to the scouts for a suitable retirement. Another Eagle Project in the works is addition of a porch and covered area for the storage shed (on the picnic grounds side). By the way – the city has numerous projects for community service and in some cases will help defray the costs.

Here's one of those "weigh that" quotes from Albert Einstein: "The significant problems we face cannot be solved at the same level of thinking we were at when we created them." That came from Stephen Covey's "The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People" which didn't take the first two times I read it, so I'm giving it another go.

For the golfers and other Tiger Point residents: By the end of March we should have a new contract in place for the management of the golf course. The city is close to signing an agreement with Honours Golf, a division of Troon Golf, which operates numerous courses in the Gulf Coast area.

HELP NEEDED!






